Dear Motor Carrier:

The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) assesses motor carrier safety using roadside inspection information and crash reports from the last two years. FMCSA organizes this safety data into seven Behavior Analysis and Safety Improvement Categories (BASICS). Based on the crashes reported to us by State agencies within the past twenty-four months, FMCSA's records show that QUEST LINER INC's **Crash Indicator BASIC** is at a level that indicates a risk of additional crashes. We are bringing this safety problem to your attention so that you can take corrective action. You do not need to respond to this letter.

FMCSA encourages you to visit the FMCSA Portal Website at <https://portal.fmcsa.dot.gov/> to review your company's safety data, assess your safety management processes and practices, and take steps to reduce the risk of QUEST LINER INC's involvement in crashes. Using your Personal Identification Number (PIN) above, you can create a USER ID and Password, which will allow you to see your entire safety record, including your Crash Indicator BASIC percentile and other information that is only available to you and FMCSA-authorized enforcement personnel.

The crashes used to calculate the Crash Indicator BASIC percentile are weighted by the severity of the crash and include all reportable crashes regardless of the carrier's or driver's role in the crash. If you believe you have been improperly or erroneously assigned a crash, you may file a request for data review through FMCSA's DataQs program. The DataQs program allows motor carriers and drivers to request a review of information such as Federal and State-reported crash and inspection reports in FMCSA safety databases. Follow the link <https://dataqs.fmcsa.dot.gov> to access DataQs.

FMCSA will continue to assess your safety performance on a monthly basis. If this indicator of your safety performance does not improve, FMCSA may conduct additional interventions such as an investigation.
